FROM THE PRESIDENT

By the time this edition of our newsletter goes to print, the 29th Annual Cooper River Bridge Run will have come and gone – and been a great success. Thank you to all who helped, and to Doug (KU4OC) for his leadership in the effort. Basic communications capability is often taken for granted, until we lose it. In those times, radio amateurs have always had a very practical ability to make existing technology work to keep information flowing. But we sometimes forget that there have been many technical advances made by Hams, and that sometimes, we have helped shape national policy and new technology.

As an example, I have been writing about Broadband Over Powerline (BPL) for a couple of years. This is intriguing technology that allows the power infrastructure to become a conduit for Internet connectivity. Unfortunately, in its zeal to make a profit, industry has pushed for the technology without thinking through all of the ramifications – most notably the potential for massive interference across a great deal of the HF spectrum. Unchecked, industry would likely fast-track the technology investments too broad to abandon, and the negative effects etched in stone. But, thanks to the efforts of radio amateurs and the ARRL, BPL technology is getting a thorough examination. And it's a good thing too, because the very HF frequencies at risk proved vital to international aid efforts after the Indonesian tsunami in December 2004, and became the last thread of communication to the Gulf Coast in the aftermath of hurricane Katrina.

Recent testing done at ARRL Headquarters with some industry BPL equipment suggests that chip set developers and manufacturers are working to minimize interference from their products on amateur bands. On March 9, a company named DS2

Incorporated brought a pair of modems using their latest-generation technology to ARRL Headquarters. Vice President of Technology and Strategic Partnerships, Chano Gómez, and Product Manager, Eduardo Lluna (EA5ETP) came along to participate in the experiments. ARRL Lab Manager, Ed Hare (W1RFI), described a 40 dB notch depth across the 20 meter band, and noted this was typical of all bands measured. This is encouraging since DS2's chip sets are used by several key BPL equipment makers; including Ambient, Amperion, Corinex and Mitsubishi, among others.

The natural disasters of the last year have punctuated the importance of careful thought about how we utilize both radio frequency spectrum, and the amateur radio service. Good technical knowledge maintained by Hams nationwide not only helps in times of emergency, but also helps shape policy, protect the frequency spectrum, and assist industry in developing better, more capable products. Due to Dan's health we would like to put Linda NeSmith, K4MPY, on the account to replace Dan. The signers should be authorized to handle the transaction. Jenny will make a motion under new business for these actions and for a 2007 Hamfest.

In addition, for information, there will be a wheel chair race component this year. Following the race, there will be a volunteer party at the Maritime center.

Next, Ken, acknowledged John Glover, of the Coastal Cyclists, and asked John to give an update on the April 2nd Century Ride. John thanked the CARS club for supporting communications for this event, especially as it follows the morning after the Bridge Run. John noted that the ride covers 100 miles and that route maps are available at the meeting tonight. Ken is the contact for volunteers participating in this event.

Emergency Prep: Bill WA4WGP

Ken AF4ZV noted that Bill is now serving as the ARRL Emergency Coordinator [EC] for Charleston County. Bill reported that last week he spent 2 days at the Francis Marion hotel to attend a meeting regarding Biohazard Responses to possible threats at the Port. Included at the meeting were groups from the FBI to local hospitals to DHEC. As a result of some contacts and networking, we may expect to receive additional assistance with the HEART project. In addition, the EC from Greenville contacted our group in Charleston to review our model for the hospital repeater network set up.

Repeater Report: Bryce K4LXF

Bryce noted that there was a report of an interference problem at the 25 repeater, testing is in progress to determine the source and resolve. Bryce mentioned that "123.0" is a standard sub-audible tone for this area. The Holly Hill repeater site had the contract expire and will need to be re-approved to continue work. The engineers plan to put the St. George frequency at the Holly Hill site and will have a 440 repeater that can tie into 2 meters at the site.
