It turns out he was in Iraq visiting soldiers from South Carolina fighting the Global War on Terror. Just prior to Field Day though, I got a call from the governor's office asking if we would like a proclamation for the event. And on June 23, I received a document proudly proclaiming the week of June 18-25 as "... Amateur Radio Week in the great State of South Carolina."

There were a lot of opportunities to learn during this Field Day, as we ran into some interesting antenna problems near starting time. Of course, we were able to diagnose and fix these... in plenty of time to ensure I didn't miss my "appointment" with the exercise bike powering our early contacts on human power! MINUTES of JUNE MEETING

MINUTES:

The Charleston Amateur Radio Society meeting was called to order by President, Ken Bible, AF4ZV, at 7:30 PM on June 12, 2006 at Ryan's Steak House, in Charleston.

Introductions:

There were 29 members and 4 guests present.

Secretary's Minutes/ Report: Tracey KG4HTW

In a motion by Sam, KX4SAM, seconded by Avery, W4QYV, the minutes were approved as published in the June 2006 CARS Carrier, with one correction. The May 8, 2006 minutes misstated the convention to be hosted at the 2007 CARS Hamfest: it read "2007 ARRL Convention" and should have stated "2007 SC ARRL State Convention". Ken, AF4ZV, read a note from Larry and Debbie Struck thanking Tom, K4WJC, for helping these mariner hams with their radio prior to setting out on a cruise.

Treasurer's Report: Linda K4MPY

The treasurer's report for the period ended May 31, 2006, was accepted as information as published in the June 2006 CARS Carrier.

Hamfest Report: Jenny WA4NGV

No new information to report.

Field Day: Doc W4MUR

Doc noted that Field Day is coming up fast. Doc asked Ken, AF4ZV, if he would ride the bike again and Ken did confirm he would take the bike. Volunteers are needed to help setup on Friday, beginning 2 PM and tear-down after 2 PM on Sunday. The event begins at 2:00 PM on Saturday, June 24th and ends at 2:00 PM on Sunday, June 25th. In addition, volunteers are needed to operate CW, contact Bob, W4HGW who is coordinating the CW station. We are still looking for assistance in getting an elected official to visit our activities and someone to copy the W1AW bulletin. Please contact Doc to sign-up or to obtain additional information.

Museum Ships: Ed KQ4DC

The annual museum Ships On The Air event was held June 3rd – June 4th and Ed extended thanks to David, KI4FSC, for coordinating activities and the others who helped work the event. There were 595 contacts and only 12 other ships were participating. There have been many requests for CARS QSL cards and we have also received the same. There are no new events scheduled at this time.

Races: Ken AF4ZV

No new requests received. The next race is normally the IOP Connector Run in October.

Emergency Prep: Bill WA4WGP, Charleston; David KI4FSC – Dorchester

Bill reported on the simulated event, which took place on June 6th, where a hurricane was to make landfall. Local hospitals participated and 8 shelters were able to test communications with the EOC. It was noted that there was a problem at the state EOC level with communications during the event.

David noted that they were called on the scene to a simulated wreck on Hwy 78 and this took most of their time during the event. The amateur radio operators received positive feedback for their responsiveness to the simulated event.

Repeater Report: Bryce K4LXF

Bryce noted that work continues with the Hospital Repeater network. In addition, the engineers are working in Walterboro and will look at the Georgetown site next. The Seabrook repeater has been unlinked due to the fact that it had been picking up some interference. All else is ok.

Drawing: The drawing for a one-year ARRL membership was won by Phillip Blaha, K4PNB.


A motion to adjourn was made by Sam, KX4SAM, and seconded by Avery, W4QYV.
