FROM THE PRESIDENT

As a club affiliate of the American Radio Relay League (ARRL), this month I want to start by ensuring our club membership is aware of an important decision this Fall dealing with the leadership of our Division within the ARRL structure the Roanoke Division. The ARRL Roanoke Division Vice Director's seat is up for contest, and I think it is important for us to take this election seriously, since at this national level, these representatives are making decisions shaping the future of amateur radio in our region and, indeed across the nation.

Former South Carolina Section Manager Patricia Hensley (N4ROS), and the incumbent, the Rev Leslie Shattuck (K4NK) are the two candidates vying for this important post. In 2000, Hensley became South Carolina Section Manager (SM), but she lost her bid for a second term to our current SM (and new CARS member), Jim Boehner (N2ZZ). We will try to publish more information on each of the candidates' platforms as the election shapes up. On other business, Tracey and I visited the Hurricane Expo on August 26 at the Gaillard Auditorium, and enjoyed seeing a number of CARS members amongst the group supporting the ARES demonstration in the tent alongside other emergency preparedness displays. MINUTES of AUGUST MEETING

MINUTES:

The Charleston Amateur Radio Society Meeting was called to order by President, Kenneth Bible, AF4ZV, at 7:30 PM on August 14, 2006 at Ryan's Steak House, in Charleston.

Introductions:

There were 35 members and 6 guests present.

Secretary's Minutes/ Report: Tracey KG4HTW In a motion by David, KI4FSC, and second by Bryce, K4LXF, the July 2006 meeting minutes were approved as published in the August 2006 CARS Carrier.

Treasurer's Report: Linda K4MPY

The Treasurer's report was accepted as information as published in the August 2006 CARS Carrier.

Hamfest Report: Jenny WA4NGV

Jenny reminded everyone of the date for the next hamfest: February 4, 2007. Flyers are ready and some shall be sent to the Shelby hamfest.

Field Day: Doc W4MUR

Doc provided a report on the results of Field Day 2006: CW-494 points, Digital-312 points, Phone-603 points, Bonus Points-950 for a total score of 3,768. Because we are missing the list of operators for the GOTA station, these points will not count.

Presently, there are enough volunteers to staff each shelter site. There was a donation of batteries for backup power and plans are to have all equipment in place over the next 3-4 months; however, all volunteers are equipped with mobile emergency equipment until permanent equipment is installed.
