The Charleston Amateur Radio Society meeting was called to order by President, Ken Bible, AF4ZV, at 7:30 PM on January 14, 2008 at Ryan's Steak House, in Charleston.

Introductions:

There were 41 members and 6 guests present.

Secretary's Minutes/ Report: Tracey KG4HTW

In a motion by James Gilbert, KI4UIS, and second by Mike Wells, WA4HVP, the November & December 2007 meeting minutes were approved as published in the January 2008 CARS Carrier.

Treasurer's Report: Linda K4MPY

The November/December 2007 Treasurer's report was accepted as information as published in the January 2008 CARS Carrier.

Hamfest Report: Jenny WA4NGV

Jenny reported that a Hamfest Committee meeting was held on January 6th and all is going well and on schedule. Just a reminder – the Hamfest will be Saturday, February 2nd. The Hamfest Committee is still looking for additional volunteers for the event— A sign-up sheet was passed around. On Friday, assistance will be needed to clean & setup as some vendors will arrive Friday evening. For Saturday, setup begins at 6:00am and the event runs until 2:30pm. Help will be needed for tear-down as well on Saturday.

We expect to be able to provide a list of vendors on the CARS website.

<u>Charleston</u>: There will be an ARES meeting this coming Saturday at 9:00am at the Charleston County EOC Building on Bridgeview Road. There will be a tour and an update on EOC activities. Bill is continuing to stay in contact with Charlie Miller regarding the RACES cards.

<u>Dorchester</u>: No new information to report. Meetings on 2^{nd} Saturday of each month at 9:00 AM at the County Sheriff's complex on Hwy 78.

<u>Berkeley</u>: A drill was held recently in which a plane full of fuel crashed in Berkeley County. It was a good test event & hams were able to keep communications going when the batteries died in other equipment. There were 11 ARES members and they were joined "virtually" by 4 Dorchester members.

Repeater Report: Bryce K4LXF

Bryce noted that John Crockett created a list of statewide repeaters that are part of the SC HEARTS network and copies are available tonight [back table.] There has been a challenge with the RC210 Controller(s) – Mike Wells, WA4HVP, explained briefly the issues with the software and the work done in communicating with the programmer. Software updates have been issued to address some corrupt code.

Mike asked members to let him know if they hear inaccurate or odd sounding announcements come over the repeaters. An example: the system announced that the Skywarn Net was today—but it was not—the system used the wrong date.

Ken Bible, AF4ZV, noted that Glen Little, WB4UIV, sent an article regarding a reminder to hams to ensure appropriate RF exposure calculations around antenna sites. The article shares the story of a radio station cited for failing to have adequate signage & controlled access to the ham's site.

Greg Amirault, KI4TVA, noted that Susannah Roth, KE4RVF, has contacted ECs in Berkeley County and Dorchester County and asked for their help to sign-up volunteers to serve as net control operators and help "re-energize" the weekly ARES net.

<u>Charlie Post Classic Race</u> – January 26th – Club member John Glover, has contacted Ken on behalf of his wife, Jana, who is the Race Director for this year's event. The Charlie Post race is asking for communication support from the CARS club for the upcoming race. They expect about 900 runners for this race, which happens at 8:30 am on Sullivans Island. The CARS club has provided support over the past several years. A motion will be made under new business.

<u>Cooper River Bridge Run</u> – Doug Clark, KU4OC, noted that he expects to receive the official letter of request for support from the CRBR any day. For the 2008 race, approximately 45 volunteers would be needed to provide communications support. The race is April 5th and anyone interested in helping, should email Doug at doug.clark@comcast.net.

Life Point 5K Run – Mike Wells, WA4HVP, noted that this event is on April 12th at Wannamaker Park in North Charleston. The event is fairly laid back and it is an easy run. Motion will follow under new business.

<u>Dubose Middle School Club, K4DMS</u> - Bryce Myers, K4LXF, asked if Alene Wilkins, KG4NKD, could provide a list of needs for the school club. Alene noted that several children have hardships and cannot afford to pay for the VE exam fee.

In a motion by Ed Walker, KQ4DC, and seconded by Alfonso Gregg, W1GRE, the CARS club agreed to allocate funds to subsidize the cost of VE exams for students who want to take their test for licensure. Following the approval of the motion, many CARS members personally donated funds to the club in support of the K4DMS school club. The total amount collected allowed the CARS club to issue a check to Alene for \$95 to support the school radio club.
