ARES NET REPORT

Amateur Radio Emergency Services is what the acronym ARES means. It is taking a hobby and using it for not only communication between relatives and friends, and making contacts all over the world but also for offering your services as a trained communicator. You are a trained communicator because you took tests to make sure you knew how to handle a radio, how to get another's attention on the radio and what is acceptable for your FCC license.

You have the choice of getting involved in ARES or not. However, I am wondering if you know, <u>really</u><u>know</u>, what you would do if say there is an earthquake? Have you sat down with your family and made a plan? This is one of the wisest things you could do. You may be signed up to go to a shelter or EOC in your county, that is great, but do you and your family have a plan? If this disaster happened on a weekday, the typical scenario would take place. Mom and Dad may be at work. Children may be at school; Grandparents may live alone and be home. First impulse is to get on the phone and make contact to see if everyone is okay. Frustration and Panic ensue because you can't get in touch with anyone because the phone lines are busy or not working at all.

This article is not an advisement of what to do; only you and your family can make those plans. Family's welfare is first of course, so before you attend to your commitment with the ARES tasks, you need to know that they will be safe. You might consider planning without a phone, just in case you can't make contact. Schools have planned and practiced their emergency situations but have you? Have you taken pictures of your goods in your home? They would be substantiation to your insurance company. Have you planned a place to meet? That may be a good idea. This article is written in hopes you can have this conversation so that your family knows what to do in case of any disaster.
