Introductions:

There were 37 members and 3 guests present.

The June 2010 meeting minutes were published in the July 2010 CARS Carrier. A motion was made seconded and passed to accept the minutes as posted.

The May 2010 Treasurer's report was in the July 2010 CARS Carrier and accepted as informed.

Hamfest Report: Jenny, WA4NGV

Jenny is working on getting an appointment with the fair grounds to set up date for 2011 Hamfest in Feb. Something she has been trying to do for about a month now. She has been told that apparently they do have us penciled in. Nothing else to report at this time.

Museum Ships: Ed, KQ4DC, and David, KI4FSC

Nothing currently going on with the Museum Ships.

Field Day: Greg, KI4TVA

Greg extended his thanks to everyone who took part in this years Field Day, setup and break down in very hot weather, to those who operated, and those who did support. The event went well, with only a few minor problems. Some reports are still pending, Greg hopes to have a full report by next meeting.

Neither Ron nor Fred were present to give a report on the Balloon Project, but it can be reported that it worked, and contacts were made on 160 and 10 meters.

Field Day Expenses: Jenny WA4NGV

The Club advanced \$500. Expenses were \$313.02 for food, gas (for generator) \$12.25. Total \$325.29 minus \$18.52 for left over food that Jenny bought back. total \$306.for food and gas. Returned to club \$193.25.

Repeater Report: Bryce, K4LXF

New Auto-patch procedure for 146.79 repeater:

Key up, ID, state intention of using auto-patch and then un-key. (This will let others know what you are about to do.) Key up and enter A1 and phone number, then un-key. Repeater will call the number dialed. When phone is answered, continue your call. Upon completion of call, enter A0, ID and clear.

Example: Key up the 146.79 repeater and state as follows: [This is K4LXF making an auto-patch call], then un-key. Key up again and enter A1 and phone number [A1 747 2324] then un-key. Repeater will call the number dialed. When phone is answered, continue your call. Upon completion of call enter [A0] and state [K4LXF clear].

The .25 repeater will be replaced with the .94 repeater when ready.

Repeater use: While the CARS, TARC, HEART and SCHEARTS repeaters can be setup in different formats and used for both training and emergency nets, these repeaters can be use by all HAMS for regular radio contacts.
