A few months ago during a club meeting, several members shared their personal experiences regarding helping others or relaying traffic during an emergency situation. With the upcoming club supported events: Cooper River Bridge Run, After the Bridge Run Ride, and Field Day, there will be plenty of opportunities for folks to practice some of the communications skills which aid in times of emergency.
