FROM THE PRESIDENT

It seems like we just finished putting away the radios, antennas, cables, extension cords, tarps, tables, chairs, logging laptops, operating band charts, batteries and generators from last year, but it is time again for Field Day. This is the club's largest operating event of the year. Some might say that the Cooper River Bridge Run or the Charleston Marathon are larger events in terms of total participation but Field Day is the larger event in terms of continuous radio operations in a contest format. I think most would agree that it is by far the more grueling operating environment. The end of June in Charleston is typically hot and humid and operating on an aircraft carrier seems to make it doubly so and partly explains why more operators sign up to operate at night.

Field day is an opportunity for amateurs of all operating classes to make contacts across the country and Canada in a simulated emergency environment. It should be obvious to those who have lived in the Charleston area for any length of time why this type of event is of particular importance in preparing for the times when emergency operations will not be simulated. There may come a day when the knowledge and skills derived from this event will become useful and maybe even critical to your survival after a major hurricane or other natural disaster. That being said, you won't find a better opportunity to make all the contacts you could ever want in whatever mode of operation you want to communicate. Even though as a club we are not contest oriented you can still test your operating skills to make the most contacts in a given time period, make the longest distance contact, or pull in that weak signal contact out of the noise.

There is still time to sign up for this event and we need as many operators as possible to man the stations for this 24 hour event. We need help to set up Saturday morning and help to take it all down on Sunday. We need help with setting up food and beverages in support of this event. Having free food and drinks available for the entire time is a benefit many clubs can't afford but it doesn't just magically appear. We need help to purchase, prepare and deliver the food and drinks to the club room.

We also need help with the public relations portion of this event; getting the word out to the community about the event and it's significance in terms of the contribution amateur radio makes in times of disaster. Don't forget about GOTA (Get On The Air)! The Yorktown will have its usual crowd of daily visitors who will be able to come to our table on the hangar deck and talk on the radio without a license through the GOTA station. You never know who might get bitten by the ham bug through their exposure to Field Day.

When it is all said and done, Field Day is another opportunity for club members and visitors to come together and enjoy this great hobby of ours, Amateur Radio. Pass it on!
