CARS 2M CW Practice Net

Ken, KC4ETW, brought up the idea of running a local CW net on the CARS repeaters to promote use of Morse code. Unfortunately Ken has not had time to follow-through on the proposal, so here are my thoughts.

Operating on the repeaters will mean we use FM transmissions. This also opens the net up to the greatest number of participants since most people have 2m FM radios. Unfortunately most FM rigs are not set up to support CW keyers, so we should operate in a hybrid CW/phone mode.

The order of the net could be:

- Request to use the repeaters / open the net in voice
- Open the net for CW check-ins
- Open the net for phone check-ins
- Request a report from each CW operator. Potentially use some traffic net Q-signals to make things easier (e.g. "no traffic").

- Request a report from each phone operator
- Net control redirects questions, repeats, translates missed code, etc.
- Close the net in CW
- Close the net in voice and return repeaters to normal use

We clearly would need a net control operator who is patient and can handle all levels of code proficiency. We also need to figure out the best speed for the net control to operate. Since this is a practice net, maybe 7-10 WPM with lots of spacing? Net control should have flexibility to interact with operators at speeds appropriate to the operator (challenge him) and repeat at slower speeds for others, if needed.

CW operators with all-mode rigs should operate in FM and key their microphone while transmitting. Be mindful of background noise and give the repeaters time to key up before sending.

CW operators with FM rigs will need to be able to send code. There are kits to generate modulated CW (MCW) tones.

Monday, Friday, and Saturday are three nights without other scheduled net activity, though Mondays will have a net on the SC HEART VHF side when school starts up.

John, W3KH, is OK with our running a CW net on the SC HEART repeaters; he just asks that we let him know when we'll be doing it.

2012 Field Day Wrap-Up

CARS participated in the ARRL Field Day from the USS Yorktown again this year, and I think it was a successful event. There was some concern at the last minute that other scheduled events on the ship would prevent us from working there, but thanks to Bryce, K4LXF, and Greg, KI4TVA, meeting with Patriots Point management we got everything worked out. We actually had a backup site just in case, but didn't need it. Maybe we can use that for Winter Field Day.

Our submitted score was 1186 points (we had 1670 last year). We had 536 QSO points: 202 phone QSO at 1 point each and 33 digital QSO at 2 points each with a power multiplier of 2. We got 650 bonus points: 300 for running our three stations on emergency (generator) power, 100 for inviting the media to come (though they didn't make it), 100 for operating in a public place, 100 for having a public information table (part of our GOTA station) and 50 for submitting our logs using the online tool. On Friday afternoon we set up two vertical antennas and a dipole, and got the trailer and generators in place. Saturday we finished setting up and started operating at 2pm local time. The phone station operators didn't verify their radio's settings, and found themselves operating "QRP" at 25 watts for an hour or two. Once that was figured out, the contacts came quickly. The evening crew came, then the overnighters. Unfortunately we had three generators die at the same time, but 2 visitors from the Myrtle Beach area had some marine batteries and were able to get us back on the air until we resolved the operator error on one generator. New crews arrived Sunday morning and kept us operating until 2pm, when we secured the site. Wess, W4RUX, is going to look at the generators to see what failed.

The bands were in pretty rough shape, but we managed a good number of contacts. We were unable to make any contacts through the satellites, largely because there simply were not many good passes during the contest period. When the HF bands did open, there were many operators stepping all over each other. Whether it was deliberate or just a quirk of propagation isn't clear.

All stations used computer logging this year, and it made it very easy to compile the logs. We discovered early on that the software didn't appear to be saving logs properly, and were sure to make frequent manual backups. Next year maybe we can stock up on batteries and minimize generator use. There were lots of other lessons learned.

One area we still need to improve is our off-the-air activities, especially food service. The schedule was built around what people said they could work; if you can't make a shift let the Field Day Captain know and make alternate arrangements. We really need the younger operators to step up since we're the future of the club and need to learn how to run the operation. We can also handle the heat a little better.

Special thanks go out to Jenny Myers, WA4NGV, for preparing the delivered food for consumption despite the fact that she wasn't supposed to do so and had a fainting spell in the midst of it all. Also Walter, KK4DFZ, for ensuring we'd never run out of gas for the generators, Eugene, KK4JRP, for helping buy and deliver food, Shann, KI4YSR, for bringing out his satellite station, Dan, NY3V, and Larry, KJ4GZR, for trying to operate the GOTA station directly underneath the generators, Ken, KC4ETW, for a valiant attempt at running the CW station, and Bobby, W4KSD, for letting us use his brand new Honda generator. Our other operators, loggers, and helpers not already mentioned include: Buddy, AB4SN; Doug, KU4OC; Ron, AB5WF; George, KI4NNK; Willie, WB4SOG; Wayne, WB4SOF; Mike, WB4ZOE; Karen; Tracey, KG4HTW; AnnMarie, KK4ILZ; Warren, KK4EVI; Steven, KG4ULR
