FROM THE PRESIDENT

The 2013 Charleston Marathon is now history with my profound thanks to all who participated. It was a long day for many of our members; some of which had to move their station not once but twice to cover most of the course. We could have used another 6 to 8 people to make it an easier day. The event was successful by all accounts and there were only a few stations calling in with requests to treat and or transport runners who were injured or just too tired to complete the race. The benefit to our club was three-fold.

The first benefit is the exposure our club receives from supporting these races which in turn generates interest in amateur radio and potential new members. The second benefit is the opportunity for club members to come together and enjoy the comms facet of our hobby. But the biggest benefit I see is the insight into emergency communications support we gain every time we support an event of this nature.

Much like an emergency operations coordinator, Doug Clark our race coordinator, has to look at the scope of the event and determine what assets he will need. He then needs to determine how best to deploy those assets to provide the best overall coverage for the event. He creates a comms plan that outlines everyone's duties and a timeline for the sequence of events that needs to occur to have a successful outcome. Having solicited volunteers from the club to participate and having developed the best plan given the resources that have committed to participate, Doug adjusts the plan numerous times as members drop out or step up at the last minute to help. On the day of the race he had to deal with potential no shows (of which we had 2 this year) and with the course changing from last year, Doug had to make sure

everyone knew where their stations were and had the equipment they needed. Regardless of what challenges befall him he makes it work with what we have. How is this any different than how we would perform in an emergency situation? You may not realize it, but every time we participate in a race, we are rehearsing for an emergency situation. Despite the challenges, we succeed every time and I have no doubt that when the next disaster strikes our community we will succeed in that time. Amateur Radio, Pass it on!
