ARRL Membership Benefits for Newly Licensed Amateurs and Members

The following 2 paragraphs are from an article published by ARRL in May 2014 QST page 13.

How does a newly licensed Amateur Radio Operator purchase the necessary equipment, assemble a station, learn proper operating techniques, and actually get on the air? How does he or she learn about transceivers, antennas, operating modes, propagation, repeaters, and how to connect with local emergency preparedness groups? It may seem like an overwhelming task, but the ARRL has programs, services, and volunteers to help with all of these things.

Resources: Online and in Print

Along with QST, the best resource for new amateurs is the ARRL website www.arrl.org, which is jampacked with information about all aspects of Amateur Radio. If a new amateur would like to "test drive" the ARRL website, he or she can sign up for a 90-day Online Guest Account that gives prospective ARRL members limited access to the ARRL's web services.
