

FROM THE VICE PRESIDENT

Recently the CARS flagship repeater, the 146.790 machine on the USS Yorktown, went offline. Did you know how to get back into the linked system?

There are many linked repeaters in the CARS/TARC system. There is some overlap, which is a good thing in the case of an outage. If you were downtown and rely on the 790 repeater, did you know the MUSC Rutledge Tower system on 444.825 MHz provides similar coverage?

Now is the time to look at the repeater link graphic and the repeater by location maps on the WA4USN.org web site. Figure out what repeaters cover your location and program them into your radio. For the most part the hospital repeaters provide very localized coverage, but the MUSC Rutledge Tower and Trident Medical Center systems cover a good amount of ground.

Lots of people monitor the repeaters, but are generally busy doing other things. If you call for a radio check, you're more likely to get a response from someone who doesn't have time for a ragchew. On the CARS repeaters you can also press your PTT button and key 44 on your keypad. At the prompt key your radio and say something. The repeater will play it back for you. That will give you a good idea of your signal quality. This time the repeater outage was due to a failing power supply. Last time it was because the pier was cut open to welcome the USS Laffey back to Patriot's Point. Next time it may be a hurricane blowing an antenna off-axis. Get prepared now and be ready!
