EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Recently we as communicators have had the opportunity to test our skills and our ability to deploy. I wish to thank everyone who supported the Charleston Marathon. It was good weather, fun and tested communicators skills in a variety of situations. From doing double duty at different Mile markers causing a relocation event and just being observant and providing additional safety monitors on the course.

Things I learned are that radio batteries are less efficient in cold temperatures and need back up or stored in a warm place, food and water come in handy, and a question for everyone. "How did you identify yourself as an emergency communicator to the runners and public in general?" Did you keep a copy of the fine Communications Plan handy? A great source of phone numbers to other people on the course.

A mention to recent weather, "Snowmeggdon" blanketed the area North of the Low Country but late January and February are good months for Ice storms which means cold nights, frozen water pipes and downed power lines and trees. Think about an alternate source of heat without power, a way to cook without power and a way to see in the dark. Stock your vehicles with a blanket and emergency food. Check your flashlights for good batteries and bulbs and check the fluids in your vehicles. Stuck on the side of the road is never fun and during a storm, help may be slow in arriving.
