EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

The winds of March are here now. Time to make plans for antenna work to repair winter damages and build and install new antennas for this year. Remember to be safe when installing, repairing, or moving your own or other hams antennas. Always have a ground crew to assist and stay clear of overhead wires. Make sure to take all precautions if digging so you don't cut a phone line or worse underground power lines.

Up coming events that test communications equipment and your own skills are the Cooper River Bridge Run, and Bike Ride after the Bridge Run. Operators are always needed and it is a good way to practice deployment and operating outside of the home shack. Contact Doug, KU4OC, for CRBR and Tom, K4WJC for Bike ride.
