## **EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS**

Starting Tuesday is August already. August is one of the peak months for Hurricane development in the Atlantic. According to the "Farmer's Almanac" August 15<sup>th</sup> is the earliest a major storm hits Charleston so "Beware the Ides of August." Now is also the time to check out your evacuation stuff and route and fine tune everything.

A predicable event in August is the Solar Eclipse on August 21<sup>st</sup>. Officials are expecting a million + (1,000,000+) visitors and watchers. Currently the Charleston County Emergency Operations Center (EOC) will be open between 0900 to 2100 if aid is needed in the area. Because of this, I will have an ARES net with a Roll Call sometime between 0915 to 0930 and another Roll Call between 1345 and 1400 just before the event. Nothing is expected to happen but please have a radio tuned to the local

linked repeaters just in case (CARS and TARC). Please continue with your regular plans for the eclipse just listen in case and protect your eyes.
