Celebrate a few anniversary events along with NASA with the NASA On The Air program

(https://nasaontheair.wordpress.com/). Club stations at various NASA facilities will be on the air throughout the year for special events to commemorate the founding of NASA (1958), the Apollo 8 launch (1968), and the ISS launch (1998).

A 50th anniversary celebration! Did you know that in just a few years, CARS will celebrate its 50th anniversary? The club was formed March 3, 1971 and called the Holiday VHF Society. A few years later, in January of 1978, the club got its current name. If you haven't already, go have a read through the CARS 25th anniversary booklet (http://wa4usn.org/history01.htm) on the wa4usn.org website.

In anticipation of this momentous occasion, I've started collecting some ideas for a CARS 50th Anniversary Project.

CARS Archive - This would be a collection of stories, recollections, and histories from as many current and former CARS members as possible. We would also include major club accomplishments, such as establishing the HEART repeater network. The concept would be similar to Story Corps (https://storycoprs.org/), or like the QSO Today podcast by Eric Guth, 4Z1UG (http://www.qsotoday.com/). Stories would be collected in whatever format is possible (written, audio/video interviews, etc) and archived on the website.

CARS Scholarship - Establish a scholarship through the ARRL Foundation Scholarship program (http://www.arrl.org/scholarship-descriptions) to support one or more recipients. The scholarship could be funded through CARS hamfest proceeds, and/or donations from club members.

CARS Website - John Meyers, WA4GPS, has done a good job of keeping up the club website for the past 12 years. If the archive project goes forward, we'll probably need a new website to accommodate the archive.

WA4USN special events and activations - How can we let this anniversary pass without having special event activations of WA4USN, NH4TI, and NJ4DU? We could have these throughout the year to commemorate our 50th anniversary. The anniversary of the club's founding will be March 3, 2021, so we could do a week long special event to commemorate the anniversary.

Any graphic designer types out there willing to design a special 50th anniversary QSL card for the club to send out?
