EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

By the time everyone reads this we will have had a snow storm with ice, and what seems like weeks of below freezing temperatures. The question to ask is where is the Global Warming that everybody is talking about. Remember we still have another 6 to 8 weeks of winter to go so stay observant and prepared.

Hope every body has a great time at the Hamfest and gets everything you need for up coming projects. Always make a list so you don't forget something you need for those projects.

Reminder, the SkyWarn net is on vacation currently but will restart again on April 3, 2018 at 2100 hours local time on the SCHEART network of repeaters. It will meet every first and third Tuesday during the rest of the seasons.

There will be NO Charleston County ARES meeting in February. I will be out of town in Columbia. We will be getting training at the State

EOC by Gabe Turner, South Carolina Emergency Management Division, Billy Irwin, K9OH Section/State Emergency Coordinator, and George Mudd, KK4F District 5 Emergency Coordinator. They will be training us on State EOC procedures and communications procedures during emergency nets and familiarizing us with State radio capacities. I will be taking notes to get everybody locally up to speed later.

Next announcement is the March Charleston County ARES meeting will be at the C.A.R.S. Communications trailer. We will be training on the features of the trailer and improvements needed. The location is: 6390 Dorchester Road, North Charleston, SC. This is between Micheaux Parkway (Boeing entrance) and Air Force Base gate 5. The Low Country Firefighters Support Building.

I think we in Charleston County ARES should be willing and able to assist during emergencies in either Berkeley and Dorchester Counties. And of course they should be willing to assist us. In that concept of cooperation we need to train ourselves on the Dorchester and Berkeley counties equipment and procedures. So plan on a schedule and location for mutual training in the future. Also start listening to and checking in on Sunday nights to the Low Country ARES net from 2000 to 2020 local on the local repeaters and switch to SCHEART repeater system for the South Carolina ARES net. Both nets cover topics about emergency equipment, procedures and best practices when we are needed for emergency communications. Those that listened on January 21, 2018 got a suggestion(s) for building a "Go Kit" and there will be further training later.

Another net is the Thursday morning SCHEART net on the SCHEART repeater system starting at 0900 local. This net is designed for hospitals and health care folks but the training topics cover all

forms of communications and service to hospitals. As Hams and ARES we need to be trained and available for emergencies in Hospitals. A cut fiber line near a hospital could cause a major failure to a hospitals internal and external lines of communications. This is an area that has been allowed to wither away and will require action from ham community to solve.

A new requirement from Department of Homeland Security/FEMA now requires any medical facility that accepts Medicare/Medicaid patients now has to have a back up communications network. No word on what South Carolina will require or just how extensive hams will be involved but stand by as more is learned I am sure hams will be requested and can support this requirement. Remember the motto "When All Else Fails" hams provide.
