For those who are ARRL members and ARES members you should sign up for the two newsletters the ARRL provides weekly in the form of an e-mail. These newsletters have a lot of good information in them weekly. As an example, FEMA is re-working the main ARES courses in the ICS system. FEMA is re-working IS-100,200,700, and 800. FEMA is working on the forms used, best practices, and reevaluating volunteer service worth. If you haven't done the ICS courses in over ten years FEMA and ARRL recommend you redo them this year to get you up to date on new changes. According to FEMA your volunteer service is valued at about \$ 24.00 per hour.

With the March Charleston County ARES meeting we will be meeting at the CARS Communications trailer site: Low Country Firefighters Support Bldg. 6390 Dorchester Road, North Charleston (near gate 5 of Charleston Air Force base). We will be monitoring 146.790 repeater for direction questions.

The purpose is to get everybody, ARES or non ARES hams, familiar with the trailer and equipment inside. There is different equipment, antennas, power sources, etc, etc. We will also be making a list of additional improvements to help the trailer committee make recommendations to the CARS club to make this trailer a valuable asset to the Club and community as a whole.
