EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

June 1, 2018 the start of Hurricane season, runs until November 30, 2018. Already have the seasons first named storm "Alberto" shows up before June 1st. The storm formed off the Yucatan in the Gulf of Mexico and headed North. Demonstrates that planning on 7 to 8 days warning doesn't happen in early season storms, they form quickly so NOW is the time to be ready not just start thinking about getting ready.

June 6, 2018 is Charleston County Annual disaster certification exercise. This year the simulation will be 40 hours after a major earthquake struck. Amateur radio will be included in the exercise so expect to hear communications on the local linked repeaters and potentially HF traffic as well. The messages will be started with "This is a Drill" and closed the same way. If a request for support goes out please respond with proper message/net


Requested funds to purchase a plaque to thank John for Alberta's Tapestry. Voted on and approved.
