I wonder how many comms checks I didn't hear because the equipment didn't work and it was too late to fix it...

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Hurricane Florence was and still is a news item in the area. We in the Low Country dodged a significant storm. Highest winds recorded at Charleston airport was 54 mph not even a high end tropical storm. The local rivers are low enough to absorb the run off from the upstate and not cause severe flooding in this area. Before traveling though check the road conditions because some main and secondary were flooded and damage reports are still coming out.

Remember, the Hurricane season runs until 30 November so keep your supplies fresh and available, there is still time left in this season. And now is the time to get extra supplies in case you decide to evacuate or stay in place. Replenishment could be weeks away, not days, just like in Wilmington, NC. Also stock up on some extra supplies for your neighbors or elderly in your neighborhood that may be on fixed incomes and do not have a lot of disposable income late in the month.

Radio checks should be done before the event not during the event. When installing equipment you can check out your install by using the "44" command on the local repeaters;

Key down – Identify – push 4 twice (from dtmf pad) – release

Wait for repeater to say "ready" - Key down, record a short message

Release, you should hear your message.

Another technique is to plan your routes if evacuating and pre-program your radio with the repeaters you choose to use. Easier if you program rather than scanning. Also find the manual – I know nobody needs the manual but find it and take it along.

Please review the various linked repeater networks we have in South Carolina: 3 systems in the Low Country, CARS – TARC – HEART Systems in South Carolina:

VHF SCHEART – UHF SCHEART – DMR As well as many stand alone repeaters. Also review net procedures especially Emergency Net procedures. Remember, Check In, Listen, check out when leaving net. Remember ALWAYS listen first.
