# **EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS**

Month one of Hurricane season completed, five more to go. We had a close call near Jacksonville, FL. Storms this early do not give 7+ days of warning. Of concern is the water temperature offshore is currently like the temperatures in late July or August. This means a Cat 1 storm offshore could become a Cat 3 or 4 as it moves to shore. Stay alert. [note: a category 4 storm originating off Africa has just formed, the first ever in June – Ed.]

Heavy rains in Florida and the Dakotas caused flooding. Remember heavy rains in the Midlands or Upstate will flow down to the Low Country. Do not drive through flooded roads please, "Turn Around Don't Drown." Besides stalling your car in deep water will block the road from other vehicles and especially emergency vehicles.

Enjoy the 4<sup>th</sup> of July fireworks but be careful. Injuries are always reported because of fireworks and malfunctions. Also, as hot and dry it has been watch out for fires created by the fireworks or crazy cook outs. Keep hydrated and lots of sunscreen when visiting the beach or outside fun stuff.

Upcoming events in July:

- July 23, 2024 the Town of Mt. Pleasant earthquake exercise.
- July 31, 2024 Charleston County hurricane exercise.

I will activate the County EOC for both exercises for training. It may be necessary to unlink the 146.790 MHz repeater to simulate either a failure or for tactical use. We may even evaluate the capability of the Adam's Run repeater to fill in, that repeater is 147.345 MHz Tone 141.3. This would be done for emergency use. Stay Alert and Stay Safe.

Smith provided us a House Legislative Proclamation in support of our efforts for Field Day which is now hanging proudly in our club room.

#### **GOTA Station Report from KN4EXJ**

Well, another Field Day has past and we all seem to have survived thanks to Michelle and her magical brownies and food. She truly looks out for those who come out and man the radios in support of the club. A great big thank you Michelle.

Not to be over looked are the club engineers and those that set up and take down the antennas, radios, tables and chairs. Without their dedication and selfless efforts Field Day just would not happen.

Field Day for the GOTA Station (Get On The Air) started when Rick, Bryce, and Lee strung the long wire (130 ft) from the flight deck to the dumpster on the pier. Perhaps not the best direction, but having four antennas in close proximity together has

always been a challenge. The coax cable was run from the flight deck to the forward brow quarter deck located on the hanger deck. With the antenna up and the coax cable laid, all was in place when I arrived Saturday morning at Patriots Point.

Gaining access to the pier, the station equipment was driven down to the gangway and Dr. Steven and Ed lent a hand getting everything on board. With table and chairs in place and the helping hands of club members, banners were hung.

The equipment for the station consisted of a UHF/VHF Yaesu FT 7900 radio with a mag mount antenna powered by a 20 amp/hr Bioenno battery. This was set at the simplex frequency at 146.580 MHz. The HF radio was a Yaesu FT 891 with a LDG tuner, a 20 amp/hr Bioenno battery, and a 10-meter band pass filter. The SWR for the antenna was 1to 1.3. A small laptop was brought for recording contacts.

Literature was placed on clipboards for people to see and take. The GOTA Station is a windy place.

All was in place and ready to go by noon Saturday. Greg, my co station operator was busy checking the 10-meter band and picked up a Brazilian contest station making contact with a station in Massachusetts. It looked like the band would be good. If Greg was not playing with the radio, he was giving direction and answering questions from the many tourists visiting the Yorktown. We were in the perfect spot for the club PR station.

A notable guest was a young man from Poland, David. He was here in the states learning about jet engines and was given a tour of the club room and Field Day Station located on the forward port side gun gallery.

We had the pleasure and honor of being visited by two of our state legislators and a representative from the town of Mt. Pleasant. A group photo was taken. The ARRL South Carolina Section Manager John Gendron, NJ4Z stopped by near closing and visited with the club. See his Facebook report at ARRL South Carolina Section. Other visitors were

from the many states and some were amateur radio operators.

A rather full day, the station was secured at 1800 hrs. as the museum closed.



# CV5 and the Battle of Midway Special Event Station – from Steve AA2BB

Our club operated a special event station that ran from Tuesday, June 4th through Sunday, June 7th, commemorating the Battle of Midway and the sinking of the original USS Yorktown, CV5. The event was led by Bill Olendorf, K4KOA, who obtained a 1x1 special event call sign, W2Z. Over the four days of the event, approximately 200 stations answered our call. We set up in front of the Midway memorial on the hanger deck to be out with the public and put up a temporary antenna on the starboard side that worked well for contacts across the US and seven other countries. Bill had a special banner prepared and a QSL card printed for the event. The staff of Patriots Point showed great interest and took videos of our operation. One even made a contact! Lots of visitors stopped by and asked questions about the history of the Battle of Midway and the original Yorktown, CV5.

Participants of whom I am aware included the event Captain, Bill, K4KOA, club VP Tom, AJ4UQ, Avery, K4QYV, Mike, N4PSU, our club president,

Rick, N8BKN, among others. Based on this experience, we hope to hold more special event stations to remember the sacrifices of our veterans and share their history with our visitors.
