EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

September 10th is the peak of Hurricane season. The experts predicted 23-25 named storms this season, and as of 30 August we have had 5. Either the experts guessed incorrectly, or we are due for 18 – 20 storms yet. Please stay weather aware Hurricanes can be dangerous and the effects can be longlasting. Note today there are 4 potential storms coming off of Africa as I write this. *[plus one off of Texas/Louisiana – ed.]*

By request from the last Club meeting here is a list of important frequencies to monitor should a storm show up:

- Low Country ARES frequencies
 - Linked repeater will stay linked except 146.790 may be unlinked.

 - Berkeley County Simplex 147.585 MHz
 - Charleston County repeater 146.790 MHz -600 T 123.0
 - Charleston Alternate repeater 147.345
 MHz + 600 T 141.3
 - Charleston County Simplex 147.570 MHz
 - Dorchester County repeater 147.180
 MHz + 600 T 123.0

- Dorchester County Simplex 147.540
- National Hurricane Center
 - o 14.325 MHz USB
 - o 7.268 MHz LSB
- Caribbean Hurricane Net
 - o 7.188 MHz LSB
- Salvation Army SATERN Net (Health and Welfare net)
 - o 7.268 MHz LSB

Keep these frequencies handy. There are more but these are the primary Hurricane nets. You can also listen to the Maritime Mobile net at 14.300 MHz USB for 20-meter propagation and the ARRL has a net at 14.303 MHz USB.

The National Hurricane Center only activates when the storm is 5 days out.

FIELD DAY

This year's Field Day went as well as anyone could have hoped for. Team dynamics and the spirit of cooperation manifested by our club were something to be proud of. Senior and new club members alike came together in a way that made everything hum. As FD Captain, I had barely to lift a hand.

Despite the heat and humidity, set-up, led by CARS President, Rick Valentine, N8BKN, and Past President, Bryce Myers, K4LXF, began right on time on the first day of summer, Friday, June 21st. Together, we raised the Butternut vertical for CW and the Cushcraft R7 for SSB. Equipment was moved from the clubroom to the flight deck, antennas were assembled on deck, cables laid out, and installation completed just before the (almost predictable) thunderstorm. After the rain, we completed the connections and cleared the deck to be ready for the next day. We resumed work at 11:00 AM Saturday morning with installation of a long wire from the flight deck to the pier for the GOTA station. Tables and chairs were placed on the catwalks overlooking the harbor and tarps were installed to shelter operators and equipment from sun and rain. The GOTA station was set up at the

forward entrance to the hangar deck for easy access by the public. Brian Smith, KN4EXJ, brought his own equipment which helped tremendously. Mike Whisnant, KY4BO, brought our Honda generators from the trailer and placed them in the small alcove on the catwalk. He also picked up fuel from Spinx (ethanol-free.)









We went on the air at 2pm Saturday on CW, SSB and at the GOTA station. We had a superb line-up of operators and remained on the air almost continuously until midnight and through much of the night. We were honored to have Milt Turner, W4QD, begin our CW operations. Also on the key were David King, K5VUV, and Jonathan Ernisse, N4AKV, among others. Bill Olendorf, K4KOA, David Fleischman, KB9UJF, Vic Morawski, WA3CHM, and others started us off on SSB. Several satellite and 6 meter contacts were made by Jonathan who brought his own equipment including satellite and 6m antennas, a transceiver and battery. He made satellite contacts from the flight deck where he manually tracked the satellites from horizon to horizon. Glenn Little, WB4UIV, lent us his solar panels and a battery charged by them, enabling us to make sufficient solar contacts to qualify for 100 points. Tom Glaab, AJ4UQ, CARS VP, made plenty of contacts on digital FT-8 and copied the ARRL bulletin on digital modes. We also copied it on CW.







Michelle Mantooth, KK4WQO, did her usual superb job with the food and there was a spread to be proud of! We received many compliments on our food which included fresh deli, vegetable and fruit trays from Publix, bread and condiments for

sandwiches, chicken fingers, and for breakfast on Sunday morning, Bojangles breakfast biscuits. And of course, about 6 trays of Michelle's homemade brownies! I appreciated the coffee made by Rick, N8BKN, using the Navy method which remains known only to those who served. It could put Starbucks out of business.






Three elected officials, Sylleste Davis, State Representative, District 100, Mark Smith, State Representative, District 99, and Daniel Brownstein, Mount Pleasant Town Councilman, attended our FD. Rep. Smith presented our club with a House Resolution in support of FD which was voted on and passed by the South Carolina House of Representatives. We also received a very nice Letter of Support from our US Congresswoman, Nancy Mace. Both are now framed and hanging in our clubroom. Channel 2 News (CountOn2) broadcast a TV news item about the CARS Field Day with pictures of the Yorktown at least 3 times on Friday and Saturday. ARRL Section Manager, John

Gendron, NJ4Z, visited our station and joined us for a while in the clubroom. As in many prior years, Jim Comfort, KW4UL, came in and worked through the night on CW and SSB. Those present for the night shift heard some special stories from the Viet Nam war told by Rick, N8BKN. If you missed out, you'll probably have to wait 'til next year! We also discussed and solved several of the world's problems.







The only glitch was that my trusty Vibroplex CW paddles stopped working Saturday afternoon. After inspection by those who know their stuff, the problem was localized to the cable. As recommended, a new cable (obtained after FD) solved the problem. Fortunately, David, K5VUV, brought his Bencher paddles and we had a spare Vibroplex in the clubroom.

Operations were back to full strength on Sunday morning with all stations working to make as many contacts as possible before 2pm. The GOTA station had numerous visitors including one who made a successful QSO with the assistance of Brian, KN4EXJ. A few visitors toured the stations on the catwalk and came to the clubroom where they were suitably impressed.

Takedown went as smoothly as setup, with all equipment dismantled and properly stowed in about 2 hours. We sat in the clubroom for a short debriefing and to savor the moment of putting another FD in the books. Special thanks to our FD Co-Captain, Avery Hill, W4QYV, whose enthusiasm and hard work helped from start to finish, and to our club VP, Tom, AJ4UQ, who, in addition to his help during the event, downloaded the logs, calculated our points, and met me at the ship on July 4th weekend to help get our results properly uploaded to the ARRL. Look for them in November's QST.

The Charleston Amateur Radio Club WA4USN operating from the USS Yorktown CV-10 with GOTA Station WD4PBR accumulated a preliminary score of 3,081 points. The club operated as a 2A class station under generator, battery and solar power. Bonus points were obtained in all categories for a total of 1,355. This included points from the GOTA station for its first contact in 6 years. A satellite contact was also made. The club operated on the 40, 20, 15, 10 and 6 meter bands using CW, Digital, and Phone. A total of 863 contacts were made. Thirty club members participated in this event.
